## Liza's Special Recalls Music's "Good Old Days"

Dispensing with the comedy sketches that seem to be standard fare for all specials, Liza Minnelli will spearhead an all ong and dance salute to show ousiness Monday, June 29, at 8 o.m. on the NBC Television Netvork.

Titled simply "Liza," the me-hour color special will feaure more than two dozen tunes. Actors Anthony Newley and Michael J. Pollard and song-writng singers Jimmy Webb and Randy Newman guest star in he colorcast, which spotlights egments devoted to Broadway, novies, vaudeville, and contemorary music.

Liza sets the theme of the how by singing "Tradition" nd "Let Me Sing and I'll Be lappy," indicating that she is ollowing the show business traition bestowed upon her by nother Judy Garland and father
