

revitalizing "Midnight Strangers" LP. Richard's also

written one song each with frequent Richard Carpenter

collaborator John Bettis and Gary Osborne.

Producer Bond is best known for his work with Hall & THE CLUB MEMBERS:

Oates. And his guitar and synthesizer work complements

the keyboards of Tom (Neil Diamond) Hensley, the sax of

Ernie Watts and the back-up vocals of ex-Son-of Bill

Champlin.

THE PROMO FACTS: In '77, the writing team of Richard Kerr and Will Jennings

came up with the second most-played song of the year

("Looks Like We Made It"). Their latest are just as

accessible, but more attuned to AOR's current wavelength.

THE SALES FACTS: Kerr's songs have been selling lots of records for other

THE PRODUCER:

THE WAY TO GO:

There can be only one way to get from Point A to Point C. Especially when Point A is a gold record with The MG's called "Green Onions," at age 16. When Point B is recording with Bob Dylam, Barbra Streisand, Paul Simon, Isaac Hayes and Otis Redding. When Point C is producing and co-producing gold for Rita Coolidge, Bill Withers and Willie Nelson. There's only one way. And his name is Booker T. Jones.

POINT D:

Booker's official return to the A&M roster. As a vocalistorganist-composer-arranger who can take you any place worth going.

### BOOKER T. JONES/TRY AND LOVE AGAIN CONTINUED

THE SONGS:

Three Motown classics, done to a Booker T.: the Marvin Gaye hit "Ain't That Peculiar," the Stevie Wonder winner "I Was Made To Love Her," and the Supremes' last hit with Diana Ross, "Someday We'll Be Together." Plus Booker's self-penned softcore disco "Let's Go Dancin'" -- and one he co-wrote with Tom (Rita Coolidge/"You") Snow. With Bob Dylan's "Knockin' On Heaven's Door" and ex-Eagle Randy Meisner's title tune just part of the "and more."

THE PLAYERS:

Names -- and good feelings -- you'll recognize from recent Rita Coolidge sessions: including Jay Graydon, Dennis Belfield, Mike Baird and Mike Utley.

THE PROMO FACTS:

If AOR doesn't remember his classic "Chronicles" album, then surely they know Booker from his ties to Rita's "Higher And Higher." If not, tell them to ask Top 40, A/C or R&B. 'Cause Booker's been there too.

THE SALES FACTS:

Rather than attempting to bring back The MG's, Booker's out to grow some funk of his own. By delivering contemporary crossover product that should shorten the distance from Point E (airplay) to Point F (sales).

THE RESULT:

The few remaining places --- and people --- his music has yet to get to can all be reached from this point.



McCann's "Swiss Movement" duet with Eddie Harris brought the Montreux Jazz Festival to the pop charts. And his presence on the "Soul To Soul" soundtrack album helped do the same for the Ghana-based music festival.

THE MAN NOW:

Already serving as America's keyboard jazz ambassador to the world, The Man also represents one of the most compelling voices anywhere. A voice appropriately presented on his A&M debut by producers Paul (Stevie Wonder) Riser and Herb (A&M) Alpert.

THE MAN'S SONGS:

His own include two instrumentals and two vocals. His interpretive readings include a soulfully disco version of Billy Joel's "Just The Way You Are"--to be pulled as a strong first single--plus "How Can You Live (Without Love)," from the Zane Grey-Len Ron Hanks team that gave L.T.D. "Back In Love Again."

THE MAN'S SUPPORT: A carefully-culled horn section (including George Bohanon and Vincent DeRosa), complementing smooth strings and tight rhythm.

THE MAN'S PRAISES: The Herb Alpert liner notes call Les "musical, original, sensitive and whimsical...Those magical ingredients that spell greatness...I'm a fan of The Man!"

THE PROMO FACTS: Radio sees Les as one of the most heavily respected men in black music today. Here's the album to make him one of most heavily played.

THE SALES FACTS: Past associations with Roberta Flack indicate the scope of his potential audience. One which airplay should make a reality.

THE RESULT: A&M, The Records & Tapes presents Les McCann, the Man & Music.



50-city tour.


